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Will a Limón oil refinery create jobs in Costa Rica?

President Rodrigo Chaves announced that there is substantial interest from multiple investors in establishing a oil refinery in Limón,with the aim of creating jobsin Costa Rica. The president emphasized that this initiative is among the 'major projects' underway for the Caribbean province.

Does Costa Rica have a oil pipeline?

Costa Rica's state oil refinery Recope is owner of a 415-kilometer pipeline systemstretching from the Caribbean port of Moín to Barranca on the Pacific coast. The system's main section is a 12-inch diameter,176-kilometer multi-product pipeline that transports fuel from Limón to La Garita via El Alto.

Who leads the Costa Rican oil refinery (RECOPE)?

Juan Manuel Quesada,the head of the Costa Rican Oil Refinery (RECOPE),is leading the discussions. The negotiations and discussions are underway. He has spoken about expediting certain legal matters and won't proceed with a refinery if \$150 million of public funds result in nothing.

Where does the Costa Rica gas pipeline go?

The pipeline transports gasoline (Super and Plus 91), diesel and jet fuel. The pipeline runs from the port of Moín on Costa Rica's Caribbean coast to Recope's Barranca facility near the Pacific coast, passing through intermediate Recope stations at Siquirres, Turrialba, El Alto and La Garita, Costa Rica.
